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Hackberry louisiana fishing guides

Bayou State, Pelican State, or simply Sports Paradise – whatever you decide to call it, Louisiana is undoubtedly one of the top sports fishing destinations on the Gulf Coast. Even the most hardcore mermaids can find a challenge here. Come spend some time in Hackberry, LA fishing waters that locals call the speckled salmon capital of the world. Shallows, mangroves, bays, canals, lake pigs, and of course, the Great Gulf of Mexico – the list of fisheries produced in the region will impress any angling enthusiasts. Hackberry fishing is often meant to explore Calcasieu Lake, Black Lake, and the Bay, but this is just the beginning. Hackberry fishing rules can also take you to check for bite marks on the Calcasieu Strait, Lake Charles, Intercoastal Canal, West Cove, Lake Prien and Lake Moss. You'll be targeting The Holy Trinity: Redfish, Trout, and Flounder, but there are plenty of other fish in the prolific waters, as well. You can also follow Sheepshead, Tripletail and Cobia, along with a variety of freshwater species. You just need to know where to look, or simply book a trip with some experienced local captains. Hackberry fishing wouldn't be what it is without Calcasieu Lake, also known as Big Lake among locals. Surrounded by swamps, dotted with oyster reefs, and famous for its speckled salmon, this lake covers an area of about 80 square miles and an average depth of 4-6 feet. Calcasieu Lake is a trout record-breaker for many - three out of 10 Louisiana salmon records originate here. Spots on the lake can usually weigh 5-8 pounds, but specimens weighing 9-11 lb are not uncommon. The large school of Red Fish can be found in abundance, along with delicious Flounder. Brown shrimp and white shrimp are also residents of the lake. Redfishing is incredible throughout the year and Flounder is often caught on the same trip. In addition to these species, Calcasieu Lake will give you the opportunity to come face to face with Sheepshead, Cobia, Black Drum, and Tripletail. Whether you're focused on swamps, intercoastal areas, or oil rig hotspots, Calcasieu Lake has you covered. Located just 4.7 miles west of Hackberry, Black Lake is a good choice, especially if you want to try something completely different from Calcasieu Lake. Unlike chasing Reds, Specks, and Flounder in most Calcasieu estuary fisheries, Black Lake will have you focused on other species. Here you'll find Striped, Smallmouth, and Largemouth Bass, along with Walleye, Catfish, Rainbow Trout, Pike, Perch, and more. Spin, fly fishing, and baitcasting are the most popular techniques on the lake – choose your weapons and get ready to fight. Just make sure that the stream is open to fishing before booking a trip. In addition to its incredible fisheries, Hackberry offers Gulf fishing trips as well. Before passing the parade, the Calcasieu Strait enters the bay at Calcasieu Pass, south of Lake Calcasieu. Surrounded by a 2-mile stretch of rock jetty, the Pass attracts schools of fish, especially in summer. Monster Trout can be caught in the Gulf in mid-summer and late summer, moving into colder waters. Fishing for them is especially produced near oil platforms. Red fish and halibut can also be found in these waters, along with Cobia, Tripletail, and more. And if you want to venture further into and out of the Gulf, the possibilities are endless. Most Hackberry fishing guides use both artificial and live bait. When it comes to live bait, shrimp are especially popular, along with crocodiles, pinfish and fish. If you want to focus on catching salmon trophy this famous area, you will need larger bait than usual. Spots over 3-4 pounds will often starve fish rather than shrimp. Pinfish, menhaden, mullets, croakers, and even juvenile salmon are what they will go for. The upper bait is also a good choice. Good tip: search the schools of large red fish when looking for large salmon - they are often found swimming nearby. Light resolution is almost the default option in the area. Depending on the species targeted and fished, you can try your hand at spinning, flying fishing, drifting, jigging, popping, and bottom fishing. A basic fishing permit is required for all fishermen aged 16 and over who want to keep their catch. Plus, you'll need an L.A. saltwater permit if you decide to pursue saltwater species. If you want to go on an all-day trip, eight hours on the water will cost you \$600-\$750 for a party of four. Half day trips take 4-5 hours and will usually make your wallet lighter than \$500-\$550. Located three and a half hours from New Orleans and two and a half hours from Houston, Hackberry is easily accessible by car via I-10. You can also use Louisiana State Highway 27 if you are from the direction of Holly Beach to the south or Sulfur to the north. Fly in? Your best choice will be Lake Charles Regional Airport, located 33 miles from Hackberry. Your other option is Jack Brooks Regional Airport, 100 km from Beaumont. Whether you're looking to land that larger-than-life Trout or have an unforgettable day on the water with your family, you can't go wrong with Hackberry, LA fishing. Download...
